Child Sex Ratio

Provisional data of Population under Census 2011 have been released yesterday on 4th April 2011 in Bhopal.

It was an event that painted bleakest picture of Development in Madhya Pradesh; in short, Survival of Girl Child is compromised.

Census 2011 data is showing a very negative sign and shocking decline in Child Sex Ratio (Ratio of male and female under the age of 6 Years).

The child sex ratio has declined by 20 points from 932 (2001 census) to 912 girls per 1000 boys.

Some points

- 1. There were 4 districts with less than 900 girls; those were Morena, Bhind, Gwlior and Datia in 2001 Census.**
- 2. BUT Latest figures show that now 10 districts are with less than 900 girls, these are Bhind, Morena, Gwiour, Datia, Shivpuri, Tikamgarh, Chatterpur, Rewa, Sheopur, Indore. There are 2 districts at margin – Narsimpur (900), Guna (901).**
- 3. Another alarm bell – Rewa division is seeing decline of 35 points in child sex ratio and reached to the bottom of 902, it was 937 in 2001 census.**
- 4. Division wise decline – Gwalior (-21), Chambal (-20), Sagar (-17), Rewa (-35), Shahdol (-22), Ujjain (-22), Indore (-24), Bhopal (-16), Narmadapuram (-16), Jabalpur (-14).**
- 5. Please note every district of Madhya Pradesh has registered decline in Child Sex ratio except Bhind (minimal increase of 2 points).**

Overall Sex Ratio

As far as over all sex ratio is concerned Madhya Pradesh registered a increase of 11 points from 919 girls per 1000 Males to 930 in 2011 census. 2 districts of Rewa division – Rewa (declined from 941 to 930) and Singrouli (declined from 922 to 916) have shown decline in overall sex ratio as well.

Only one district of Madhya Pradesh (Balaghat - 1022) had positive sex ratio in 2001 census, but now 4 districts (Alirajpur – 1009, Dindori – 1004, Mandla – 1005 and Balaghat - 1021) having positive sex ratio, BUT these districts also showing decline in Child Sex Ratio.

One should mark the fact that we have best situation existing in Tribal dominated areas and once again it is established that tribal social group must not be considered as non or under developed. They are the real followers of Humanitarian principals. We can see sex ratio is declining in Urban, Casteiest and Feudalism representing districts.
